A New Leaf's Supervised Visitation Only (SVO) program provides parents with the opportunity to visit their children, in a safe controlled setting after the Department of Child Safety (DCS) takes custody of children during a crisis.

With the safety of the child being a top priority, The SVO program lessens the challenge and burden it takes for both parents and children to see one another. The SVO program is often the first time that a parent is able to see their child after placement with DCS, and represents a critical first step in helping the family heal.

Families and a DCS Specialist meet to develop a DCS case plan in order to determine services needed for the family. Support services identified in the DCS case plan frequently include SVO services. Without this program, many parents would simply be unable to see their children, making the pathway to reunification of the family much more difficult.

Staff members supervise each visit between parents and children from beginning to end. A New Leaf will also provide safe and reliable transportation to and from scheduled visits.

Eligibility for the SVO program is determined by the Arizona Department of Child Safety, please consult with your DCS Specialist.



If ineligible to participate in the SVO program or qualifications do not apply to your family circumstance, A New Leaf offers multiple programs and resources that aim to support families, create opportunities for family bonding, and develop long term stability.

Supervised Visitation Only provides visits throughout the greater Phoenix area. Visitation locations may include: visitation centers, libraries, clients' homes, and other various community locations.
