We firmly believe that anyone with a loving home and big heart can be a successful foster parent. We are accepting of all families regardless of race, ethnicity, nationality, sexual orientation, gender identity, disability, or socioeconomic status. A New Leaf welcomes and champions for intersectionality and tolerance.

Under our agency, our foster parents will obtain the necessary training (offered in English and Spanish) and guidance needed to do the incredibly selfless work of caring for a child in foster care. Our dedicated staff of licensing workers will be in the home monthly to ensure that all tools needed for success and needs of the children in your care are met. Our team attends all CFT meetings and court hearings alongside our families to provide comfort and guidance through this, at times, difficult process.

Support is one of our top priorities; making sure that our families and children are well taken care of and looked after appropriately. A New Leaf offers our parents monthly support groups, online forums, ongoing training, and child resources (i.e. diapers, clothing, formula) to ensure that they are supported every step of the way. A New Leaf strives to provide unwavering guidance to all of our foster and adoptive families from the very first time we meet.

Community Foster Care

A community foster care provider cares for children who have been placed in the system. Community foster families are able to choose the number of children they are able to care for at a time, age range, and gender. These children are typically placed on an emergency basis looking for immediate placement after being removed from their primary caregivers.

Therapeutic Foster Care

Our Therapeutic Foster Care Provides care to children with significant behavioral health needs or trauma history. These providers are specially trained to care for children with high needs and provide 24/7 Therapeutic intervention. Therapeutic Foster Care is meant to be a short term service provided to children on their way back to being placed in a more normalized setting.

Adoption Certification

A New Leaf staff will walk you through the Adoption Certification through the Arizona Court System. This certification will allow families to potentially be matched with children legally free for adoption in the state of Arizona.
