Autumn House Transitional Housing

A New Leaf's Autumn House Transitional Housing program provides safety and long-term housing to women, children, and men impacted by domestic violence.



Safe Transitional Housing for Survivors

Autumn House provides secure, transitional housing for individuals and families fleeing domestic violence. Open year-round, the program serves survivors of all genders in a confidential location designed to prioritize safety and stability. The facility is pet-friendly, allowing survivors to bring their animals with them.



Comprehensive Support for Healing and Stability

From the moment a survivor arrives, dedicated staff provide immediate support focused on safety and recovery. Participants receive individualized services, including case management, counseling, and assistance establishing daily routines. Workforce support helps survivors find employment, while additional services such as transportation assistance and court advocacy ensure they have the resources needed to move forward with confidence.

Ongoing Care and a Path Forward

As survivors prepare for independent living, Autumn House staff provide guidance and support throughout the transition process. Connections to housing, community resources, and continued services help ensure long-term stability. Even after leaving the program, optional support is available for survivors.



Pet Friendly Facilities

At Autumn House, we provide a safe, welcoming space for survivors of domestic violence and their pets. Cats and dogs of all breeds and sizes are welcome. Pets stay with their owners, and we offer free pet supplies. For cats, we have a dedicated sitting room when owners need to leave the site. To ensure safety and comfort, we allow 1-2 pets per unit, depending on breed and behavior.
