CAAFA Shelter and Outreach Program

A New Leaf's Community Alliance Against Family Abuse (CAAFA) Program provides sexual violence and domestic violence survivors with shelter, services, and support.



Safe Shelter and Immediate Support

A New Leaf's Community Alliance Against Family Abuse (CAAFA) provides a safe, 16-bed emergency shelter for survivors of domestic and sexual violence in a confidential location. This secure environment offers individuals and families a place to find safety while beginning the process of healing and rebuilding. In addition to shelter, survivors have access to support groups and essential services that meet immediate needs and create a foundation for stability.



Advocacy and Personalized Guidance

Through case management and individualized planning, CAAFA's trained advocates help set goals centered on long-term self-sufficiency. Services are also available through CAAFA's public office, where survivors can access support, resources, and guidance in a welcoming and accessible setting.



Legal Support and Community Connection

Lay legal advocates assist survivors in navigating complex systems, including orders of protection, custody and divorce matters, criminal cases, and victim compensation. CAAFA also provides sexual assault advocacy and community outreach services through its public-facing location, helping connect survivors across the community to critical support services.
