Court Advocacy Program

A New Leaf 's Domestic Violence Court Advocacy program provides survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, or stalking with compassionate advocacy services.



Support Through the Legal Process

The Domestic Violence Court Advocacy Program provides survivors with the support they need to navigate the legal system with confidence. Bilingual advocates, fluent in both English and Spanish, assist individuals in applying for Orders of Protection and Injunctions of Harassment. Services are available to survivors of domestic violence, sexual assault, and stalking, helping ensure they understand their rights and options every step of the way.



Personalized Advocacy and Support

Advocates offer hands-on assistance tailored to each individual's situation, including court accompaniment for protective order hearings and select family court cases. Additional services include safety planning, referrals for service of protective orders, connections to legal assistance, and access to community resources.



Serving Survivors Across the Community

The program serves individuals and families throughout Maricopa County, including those staying in A New Leaf's residential programs. By adapting services to meet each client's needs, the Court Advocacy Program provides consistent, knowledgeable support. This helps survivors move forward with safety, stability, and peace of mind.
