Domestic & Sexual Violence Services

A New Leaf's Domestic and Sexual Violence Services provide essential, trauma-informed support for those who have experienced domestic violence or sexual violence.



Domestic Violence Services

A New Leaf's Domestic Violence Services support individuals and families experiencing abuse in their home or family relationships. Using a trauma-informed approach, services focus on helping survivors create safety plans, access supportive resources, and move toward long-term stability and independence. Support may include emergency shelter and housing, personal advocacy, case management, court advocacy, and referrals to support services.



Sexual Violence Services

A New Leaf's Sexual Violence Services provide survivor-centered support focused on emotional safety, healing, and recovery for individuals impacted by sexual violence.

All services are available to survivors of all gender identities, gender expressions, and sexual orientation.
