A New Leaf's East Valley Men's Center (EVMC) provides shelter for men working to overcome homelessness and regain stability in our community.



Becoming a Resident at EVMC

EVMC serves men ages 18 and older who are experiencing homelessness and are ready to take steps toward stability. Residents may stay for up to 120 days, during which they work closely with case managers to identify goals, overcome barriers, and secure permanent housing. From the moment they arrive, each individual is met with respect and a clear path forward.



Comfortable Living Arrangements

At EVMC, residents are provided with a safe and consistent place to stay. Each individual receives a bed and a secure space to store personal belongings for the duration of their time at the center. This sense of stability allows residents to shift their focus away from immediate survival and toward rebuilding their lives in a supportive environment.



Opportunities for Personal Growth

Residents at EVMC are supported in building the skills and resources needed for long-term independence. Through personalized housing stability plans, individuals work on strengthening their financial footing, securing employment, and improving overall well-being. Workforce support is available to assist with resumes, job searches, and interview preparation, while additional services such as financial literacy, transportation assistance, healthcare referrals, and veteran resources help ensure each resident has access to the tools they need.

How to Get Help

The first step to entering the East Valley Men's Center is to complete a prescreen. You can fill out the prescreen online, or you can call **(480) 610-6722** between 8:00am - 3:00pm, Monday through Friday to complete it by phone. You may also call **(877) 211-8661** for general help.
