Faith House Emergency Shelter

A New Leaf's Faith House is a 24-hour Emergency Shelter for single adults, or adults with children, experiencing domestic violence, sexual violence, stalking or trafficking.



Safe and Dignified Emergency Shelter

Faith House operates 20 shelter units, with an emphasis on creating a safe and supportive environment for survivors of domestic violence. Residents receive three meals a day, all basic needs, and healing services. This stable, compassionate setting allows survivors to focus on their safety and begin the process of healing.



Support for Healing and Empowerment

Compassionate staff work closely with survivors to provide comprehensive, yet individualized support. Services include court advocacy, referrals to counseling, and empowerment activities. Additional assistance with employment, childcare, and transportation helps address immediate basic needs while building a path toward long-term independence.



Privacy and Security for Survivors

With a home-like feel, the shelter always prioritizes safety and comfort. Security is a top priority, with staff working round the clock to protect survivors. The shelter is hosted at a confidential location with onsite security precautions and a gated entry.



A Path to Long-Term Stability

As a vital resource in the West Valley, Faith House supports survivors on their journey toward lasting safety and stability. Services are tailored to meet each person's unique situation, ensuring they have the tools and support needed to move forward with confidence and independence.
