A New Leaf's Foster Care program licenses foster families and provides the support they need to create stable and loving homes for children in foster care.



Supporting Foster Families Every Step of the Way

This program equips individuals and families with the tools, guidance, and support needed to provide safe, stable, and nurturing homes for children in foster care. From the beginning, staff work closely with prospective foster parents to ensure they feel confident, prepared, and supported throughout their fostering journey.



Training, Licensing, and Ongoing Support

The program recruits and trains adults to become licensed foster parents. A New Leaf offers initial and ongoing training, state compliance guidance, and 24/7 on-call support to ensure families are never alone in navigating challenges. Foster parents also have access to advocacy services and resources that help them meet the needs of the children in their care.

Foster Care Support

A New Leaf offers different levels of support to foster and adoptive families through a variety of services. Monthly, virtual foster parent support groups are designed to provide encouragement, education, and connection. Foster family mentors are also available, providing experience and guidance to new foster parents. Additionally, donations of clothing, formula, and more are made available to families licensed through A New Leaf.



Therapeutic Foster Care Support

A New Leaf is able to license Therapeutic Foster Providers in order to care for children in need of a higher level of care. A New Leaf Program Staff will work with applicant Therapeutic Providers to receive the training required for this role. Providers must have a background in behavioral health in order to qualify.

How to Get Licensed

If you are interested in becoming licensed a foster parent or certified for adoption, begin by connecting with A New Leaf's Foster Care Licensing team. Staff will guide prospective caregivers through the application, training, and licensing process while providing support every step of the way.
