# REACH Center for Survivors of SV

**A New Leaf's REACH Sexual Violence Services Center & Helpline addresses the unique emotional safety and healing needs of those who have experienced sexual violence.**



## **24/7 Support and Advocacy**

REACH Sexual Violence Services provides immediate, compassionate support through a 24-hour helpline at (480) 733-3028. Survivors can access emotional support, personal advocacy, safety planning, and resource referrals at any time. Services are available in-person at the REACH center, virtually by phone or Zoom, or through mobile advocacy in safe community settings.



## **Healing and Survivor Support Services**

REACH offers a range of services designed to support healing and recovery. Survivors and their loved ones can participate in support groups and weekly holistic healing classes in a safe, welcoming environment. Additional resources include referrals to counseling, legal advocacy, and other services tailored to each individual's needs, helping survivors move forward with strength and stability.



## Community Outreach and Education

REACH Sexual Violence Services is actively engaged in the community, providing education and training to raise awareness and prevent sexual violence. Staff offer presentations and workshops for schools, businesses, churches, and community groups, along with participation in outreach and tabling events. These efforts help build a more informed and supportive community for survivors.



## Medical and Legal Accompaniment

Survivors can receive compassionate support during critical moments, including medical forensic exams and interactions with law enforcement. Advocates are available to accompany individuals through these processes, helping them feel informed, supported, and empowered every step of the way.
