Volunteer Income Tax Assistance

A New Leaf's VITA Program provides free tax preparation, ensuring households claim all tax benefits available without losing hundreds of dollars in paid tax preparation fees.



Free Tax Preparation for the Community

A New Leaf's Volunteer Income Tax Assistance (VITA) Program provides free basic tax preparation and electronic filing for qualifying households. Services are delivered by IRS-certified volunteers and are designed to help individuals and families maximize their refunds while avoiding costly tax preparation fees. The program primarily serves low-to-moderate-income households, older adults, individuals with disabilities, and those with limited English proficiency.



Trusted Support from Trained Volunteers

A New Leaf recruits and trains hundreds of volunteers to provide tax assistance at convenient community locations. During tax season, from January through April, volunteers help thousands of households complete and file their returns accurately and confidently.

Connecting Households to Financial Resources

In addition to tax preparation, participants may be connected to other programs and resources that support long-term financial wellbeing. This may include budget coaching, financial literacy classes, employment services, health insurance enrollment, and savings programs that support educational goals. Through these additional services, the VITA Program helps individuals and families build a stronger financial foundation for the future.

How to Access VITA

A New Leaf's VITA Program offers free tax preparation services at convenient locations across the West Valley during tax season.

Assistance sites are hosted at community and neighborhood centers, churches, schools, community colleges, and other trusted community spaces generously provided by local partners and businesses. These accessible locations help ensure the community can easily connect with free, reliable tax support close to home.
